### **BUDGET**

The Federal Budget is a document that summarizes the Government's revenue and spending for a fiscal year. This **fiscal year** runs from **1 January to 31 December**.

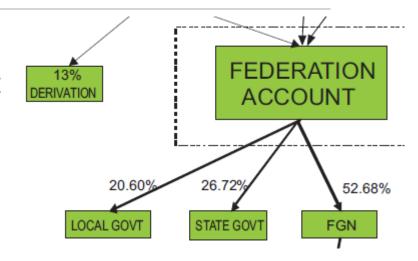
- ☐ Revenue
- ☐ Spending

April/May – May/June

The Budget gives details of <u>expected revenue</u> and <u>expenditure</u>, and presents the <u>direction of Government's</u> policies and spending priorities for a given fiscal year.

# Sources of financing the Budget

☐ Federal Government's share of the Federation Account (made up of oil and gas revenue, customs duty, company income tax),



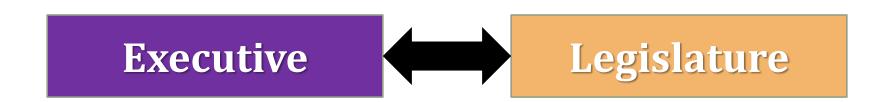
- Oil Revenue (1) Crude Oil Sales, (2) Oil Taxes, and (3) Royalties
- Non-Oil Revenue (1) Companies' Income Tax,
   (2) Customs & Exercise Duties, (3) Value Added
   Tax, and (4) FGN Independent Revenues

# **How is the Federal Budget Prepared?**

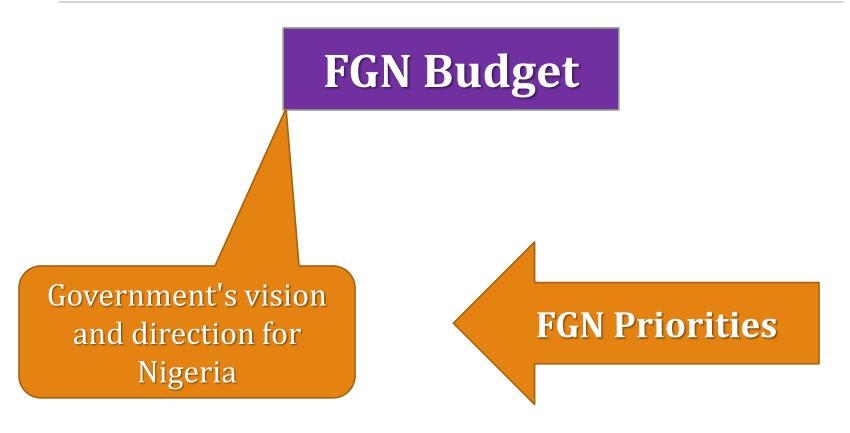
The 1999 Constitution requires the President to submit an annual budget proposal to the National Assembly for their approval (or passage).

Once the National Assembly approves the budget proposal (or Appropriation Bill) and the President assents to it, it becomes Law (or an Appropriation Act).

In this way, responsibility for the Federal Budget is shared between these two of the three arms of the Federal Government.

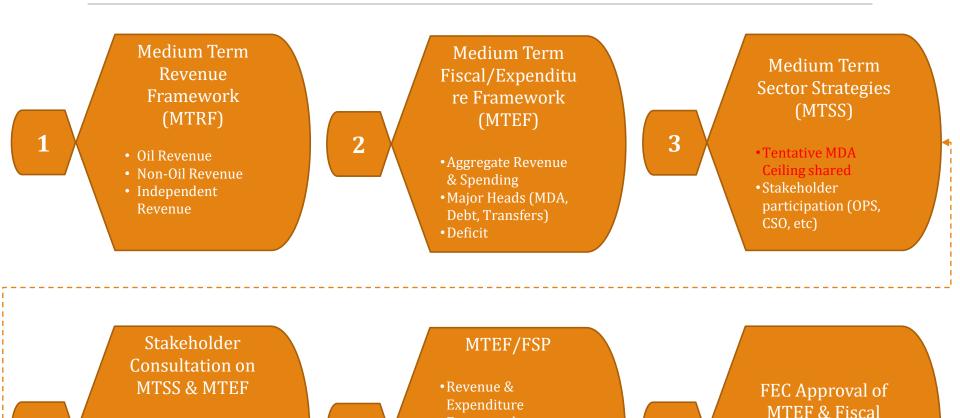
# The Medium-Term Fiscal Framework & Fiscal Strategy Paper

The Fiscal Responsibility Act (2007) provides detailed guidance about how the Budget should be prepared and what stages it needs to pass through before it is completed.

Under this law, the Budget is to be based on a mediumterm fiscal framework.

Fiscal frameworks normally include a *Revenue Framework* dealing with where the money comes from and an *Expenditure Framework* dealing with what the money is spent on.

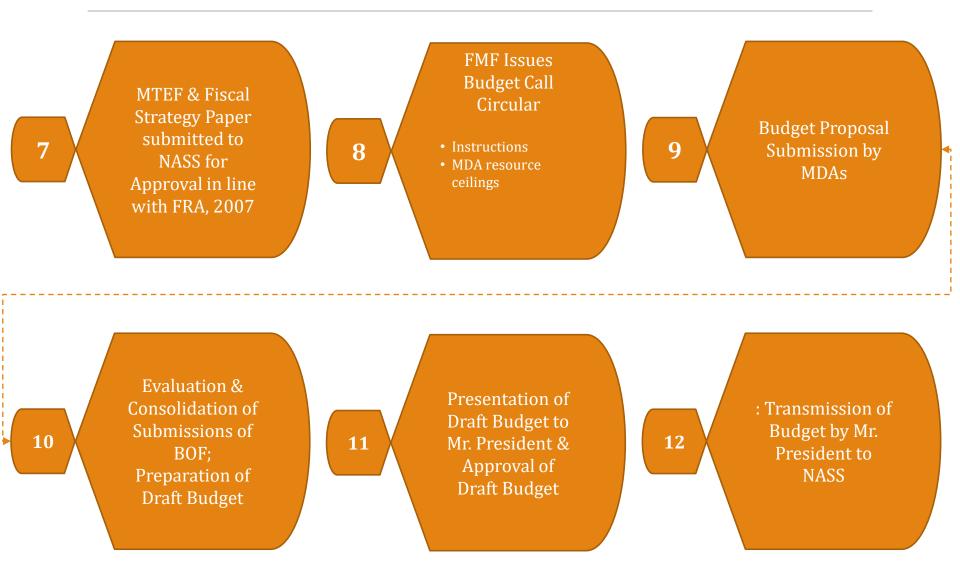

### **Statutory Transfers**

### **Debt Services**

Monies borrowed within & outside Nigeria.

### **Recurrent Expenditure**

Spending by MDAs on Salaries, Pensions & Overheads.

### Capital Expenditure

Provide infrastructure such as roads, water and power.

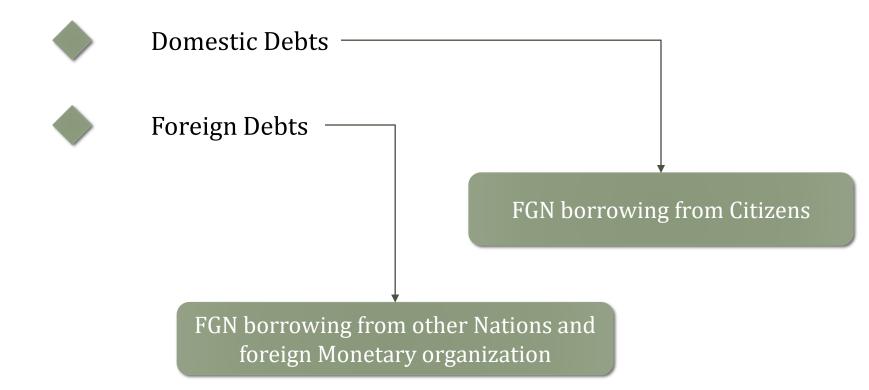

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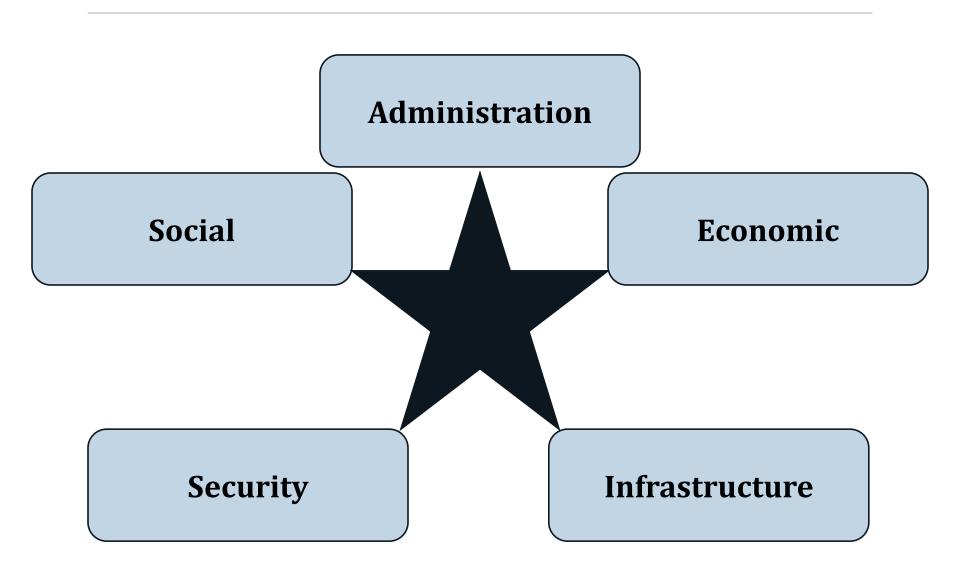
